## **Special Ask**—Angela Mitchell on behalf of the counseling staff

- Safety Smarts program
  - o Education on abuse, bicycle safety, social media savvy, etc
  - Child Advocacy Center normally teaches this curriculum
    - Can't this year for multiple reasons
  - Six weeks of lessons
  - Request PTO purchase for Shepardson use
    - We can continue teaching it this year and in the future
    - Can teach on our own schedule
    - Our counselors know our students better so can relate the material better
  - Cost:
    - \$200 per grade level (K-3) plus materials
    - Total \$895 for curriculum, materials
  - Discussion
    - Can we share with other schools?
    - Can we find it from another source that doesn't charge tax?
    - What is the longevity of the program?
  - Approved \$864 for program (tax exempt source)

## Air Purifier Request—Wayne Thornes, Sarah Putman

- Continued from Board Meeting, see Board minutes for detailed description
- Clean Air Delivery Rate with HEPA Filter
  - Current air quality in classrooms: 1.5
  - o Ideal: 6
  - Goal: 4.5 (attainable with suggested units)
- Discussion and budget review
- Unanimously approved up to \$5500 for Wayne and Sarah to purchase appropriate air purifiers

  - o Tours are available by appointment when students are not in the building

  - Checking with all usual Shepardson families who opted for another choice this year—PSD-V, homeschool, charter
  - Hope to be back over 400 student enrollment next fall
- We will have six student teachers this semester, including Trena Friehauf
- Arranging for materials distribution in case of a cohort needing to go remote
