#### **Read-A-Thon**—Sarah Putman

- This year had a record number of students participate
  - o 199 out of 418 students (including Pre-school) donated at least \$1 or more
- Also had a record amount of money earned, with more money still coming in
  - Gross \$15,326 (including two business matches)
  - o Net \$14,895
  - School helped with prizes, so more money could go directly to the fundraising effort
    - Game time with Alissa and Wayne was earned by 118 kids
    - Nine kids earned lunch with Mrs. Woodcox
    - Four kids raised over \$400, which was the highest prize level
