President's Report— April Price

Principal's Report—Wayne Thornes

- Noted there were 200+ in attendance at Movie Night
- The school lunch program is having supply issues.
 - Be aware that the choices for a given day may not end up matching the online menu and plan accordingly
- Volunteers
 - We can now have volunteers in the school
 - The teachers are using volunteers in different ways. Check with your child's teacher regarding how you can help
 - Keeping distances 3' and less than 15 minutes of exposure is the goal for enhanced Covid protocols

- Showed on the PTO website where to find the link to
 - PSD Volunteer Registration site must be registered here before volunteering in the school
 - PSD Community Portal Covid Screener this is required each time a volunteer comes into the building. Please try to complete before coming to the school
 - Return to Learn and Covid Protocols
- PBL is starting back up
 - o Fall semester teachers are creating the problems for their students to work on. It is also a shorter project time
 - o Spring semester will be a full length project.
 - An email will be sent soon looking for problems for projects from the community
- PSD is looking for Substitutes and Bus Drivers- apply with the district if interested
 - o The school has felt the need for substitutes

Treasurer's Report—Kelli Wallace

- Distributed and walked through Income and Expense report
 - Changes this month
 - Coffee Cart and reimbursements deducted from Pool Party profits.
 - Family Movie Night profit of \$88.56 (used Venmo and cash only) offered snacks for sale
 - Read-A-Thon sponsorships received \$1,200
 - Family Nights Modern Market profit \$361.33
 - Fall Grants to School highlights the areas the PTO supports at Shepardson
 - Teacher and Classroom Fund
 - Specials, I.S., and Classroom teachers (36 total) are eligible for a \$100 reimbursement each for classroom supplies
 - Note to make sure PTO does not reimburse for sales tax on purchases. PTO is sales tax exempt.
 - Printing PTO committee chairs need to check their committee budget before going to an outside printer. We only have \$85.50 left in D. PTO Admin > Misc. that could be used to cover printing cost overages.
- Audit Report presented Completed by Sherelle Reed and Libby D'Aquila
 - Report is a binder from 20/21 school year, well compiled by Sarah Putman
 - Six findings noted and commented on
 - 1. Skillman Photography does not give invoices

- 2. Check was not deposited, Kelli will follow-up with the teacher
- 4. Happened during school Covid closure
- 5. PTO will keep an eye on the sales tax reimbursements finding. No specific examples were identified in the audit.
- o 6. Information requested was added to the documentation
- Kelli will pull any reports and answer any questions
- Currently going through the tax process, preparing PTO taxes, due in November
 - o PTO hires a professional tax consultant

Staff Report - New representative - Becky Woodcox

- Staff loves the new workroom!
- Eco Week (Day) was a lot of fun
 - o Becky's first time attending
 - o CSU team did a good job facilitating and keeping participants safe

SAC Report - David Worford (PTO representative on SAC)

- School Accountability Committee
 - o The committee needs another parent member
 - o Committee meets four times a year
 - o The meetings are open to all
- Notes from the recent meeting -
 - Discussion of Unified Improvement Plan focus on Literacy, Math, Writing, and Wellness
 - o <u>Literacy</u> Scores are currently at 65% with a goal set at 85%
 - Focus on site based training for teachers
 - Increasing contact time with students
 - Work on identifying and addressing student needs
 - o Writing The district scores as a whole fell below the state average
 - The goal is to meet or exceed district average
 - Continue using the Lucy Calkins curriculum
 - Work on student reading response, stamina, and writing response
 - o <u>Math</u> Scores are currently 80% traditionally above average at Shepardson
 - School hired Math Interventionist
 - Increase identifying and supporting students working above and below the school average
 - Provide math for the parents
 - o Wellness Shepardson is considered a Wellness focused school
 - Increase counseling availability and identifying a need for support
 - There has been an uptick in anxiety and stress in everyone in the Shepardson community
 - Offer programs presenting restorative practices
- Question from Whitney Were Shepardson's drops in averages on par with the district and partially due to Covid?

o Wayne - Shepardson maintained in Literacy and dropped more in Math, yes, almost everyone had some change due to Covid

Committee Reports

King Soopers - Cara Fleckenstein

- A Google Drive has been set up for PTO Committee note sharing folder is in place for King Soopers
- King Soopers works by linking KS Shopper Card with the school and KS donates a portion of purchases to Shepardson
- Increases in linked cards = \$100/month at the start of the program, \$1600/quarter donated now
- Budget increase requested for printing expenses. King Soopers, Box Tops, and Morning Fresh Caps are a single budget item
 - Color flyers for these programs are used to encourage family participation
 - o 2021 cost of flyers \$237.90, 2021 budget \$200
 - o Request to increase budget to \$500
 - Request will be considered at the November meeting

School Supply Kits - Cara Fleckenstein

- Does PTO want to recommit to 1st Day School Supplies for Fall 2022 kit sales?
 There is no requirement for minimum kits to sell, PTO earns no money from sales.
- Cara Fleckenstein submitted a motion to recommit to 1st Day School Supplies.
 The motion was seconded by Kelli Wallace. The motion was put to vote. The motion was approved

Directory - Cara Fleckenstein

- PTO is not doing anymore
- It does have a possibility of making money for PTO
- Can be resurrected in the future

Morning Fresh Milk Caps - representative Sarah Abernathy or Julie Wenzel? Need confirmation

- Budget income is correct for this year
- Shepardson earns \$0.05/cap
- Current cap drop off location is under the reception desk in the school lobby.
 Morning Fresh has displays to encourage participation if the school would like and has space for one

Box Tops - Cara Fleckenstein

- Running a promotion through November, link is on their website
- Becky and Brit the app is glitchy and frustrating. Comments from members who reported not be correctly credited
