- For next year:
  - Continue zero-waste efforts (recyclable packaging, cloth table clothes, cones, etc)
  - Try to find bulk options for cones
  - In advertising, tell people if they would like to bring their own bowls that is a great option. It's like camping; what you bring in, you take out. Bowls, napkins, wet-wipes, etc
  - Have two tables and spread them out to have two obvious serving stations to make it faster and more intuitive
- Budget: \$200
  - o Target-\$76.43 for 9 ice cream tubs, 2 pints sorbet, cones
  - Whole Foods-\$4.28 for gluten free cones
  - King Soopers-\$6.14 for more cones
  - Sprouts-\$9.17 for even more cones at 4:45!
  - o Total: \$96.02 for approx. 300 cones
  - Left over \$103.98 to go to playground fund
