

Teacher Appreciation Responsibilities

National Teacher Appreciation Week is May 7-11, 2012. (Shepardson will not be in session Friday, May 11th)

This year Shepardson families will honor the Teachers and Staff with a Buffet Lunch on Tuesday, May 8th and Thursday, May 10th in the workroom. This will be a combined effort by several grades. Each grade/room parent has been assigned a day to coordinate bringing in food items to the workroom for these luncheons. Because so many classes will be contributing for the luncheon, little recruiting will be required by each room parent. Food should be ready for service at 11:30 and cleaned up at 1:30. Please make any attempt you can to keep cold foods cold and hot foods hot. Choosing a theme is at the discretion of the room parents involved.

Soup and salad, BBQ and Mexican have been popular theme's of the past. Note that the staff luncheons are the one exception to the "no home baked" foods rule since the food is for the teachers and staff and not for the children. Approximately 45 staff members will be eating lunch throughout the allotted time. The PTO will provide paper plates, cutlery and napkins and will be available in the workroom the day of the event. This is a simple suggestion for all the classrooms but please feel free to organize any activities that you see fit.
